Rescue Divers Save the Day

Rescue divers are called upon to save the day in water emergencies involving people or, in some cases, property. They have to think fast and act quickly—often in very dangerous conditions—to resolve each situation safely. Rescue divers often face life or death situations and put themselves at great risk to help others. Their success largely depends on skill, physical endurance, and teamwork. Some of the best rescue divers in the world are employed by the military as Navy Seals. These highly trained divers perform daring rescues as well as challenging military missions.
